## PLANTING INFO

Perennial ryegrass' germination and lateral growth make it a natural choice for establishing quick ground cover on bare soil. A seeding rate of 6 to 8 pounds per 1,000 sq. ft. or 350 pounds per acre is recommended. Under favorable conditions, germination can be expected in six days, and first mowing should occur about in about 3 weeks. Limited use of the seeded area may be realized in about 28 days. This product can be mowed as low as .25 inches; however 2 to 3 inches is optimum performance height. A fertilization rate of 3 to 8 pounds of NPK per 1,000 sq. ft. per season is recommended.
